Dear Friends

April sees the beginning of Spring and also the end of the financial year! God's economy isn't based on prudence however, but on generosity and in God's economic planning giving to others means that we will receive so much more than we can ever give. So as we look to the newness of Spring watching God's creation give so generously and abundantly let us in our turn give generously and abundantly to God. Giving generously of our money, our time and our talents sure in the knowledge that our heavenly Father will give good things to those who ask him and that in giving even a cup of water to others, we are giving to Christ himself.

May the blessings of the Risen Lord Jesus be with you all.


Please, please would someone come forward?
