Dear Friends

Teach us, Good Lord to serve you as you deserve. To give and not count the cost; to fight and not heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest. To labour and not to ask for any reward except that of knowing that we do Your Will; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

So goes the prayer of that great soldier of Christ, St Ignatius of Loyola the founder of the Society of Jesus or the Jesuit Order as it is more generally known. This prayer has been much in my mind recently as we celebrate the twentieth anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood in the Church of England. As someone who is old enough to have been part of the long struggle to allow women to become ordained, and as one of the 'first generation' of women who could candidate for priesthood and not simply the diaconate these celebrations are particularly meaningful. I can well remember being present at the first ordinations of women at Liverpool Cathedral and the joy and emotions of the memory of the momentous moment when the women at whose side I had campaigned for so long were vested with their priestly stoles can still bring a tear to my eye.

Ordination of course is not the only way that God chooses to further the work and mission of the Body of Christ, we are all members of the Body and all have our own particular ministry and task within it. Nevertheless, ordination is always a great moment as well as a

daunting prospect, for no one can lightly take up the responsibility of being a Deacon or Priest or Bishop in God's Church – indeed no one is ever worthy or good enough. The call comes from God who will provide the strength and purpose for the task.

Ordination is not simply a personal and individual thing either, for the call to be a Bishop, Priest or Deacon is a call to and from the whole Church and quite rightly the whole Church is involved in discerning the call of the individual man or woman; for each parish is not independent of the Church of God, simply the local expression of God's Church in this place and ministry both of the ordained and laity is God's ministry not ours.

Nevertheless, God does speak to individuals and calls them to consider ordination; and God doesn't seem to be put off by gender, age or education either, God calls all kinds of people to the ministry of Priest or Deacon, Reader or Pastoral Assistant. Is God perhaps calling you? Have you ever heard that little voice or had that nagging thought and pushed it aside? If you have, next time it crosses your mind, give heed to it and see where it takes you. And of course, you can always come and chat to me about it anytime!

A reflection on village life from a visitor to Mellor .

Friday 25th April.

We arrive at 7 pm and the church is heaving. A considerable achievement for a small community, and a likely testimony to its warmth and inclusiveness. The church is packed not only with people, but with the paintings. There are well over a hundred, and occupy most spaces at eye level, even round the pillars. The pictures testify to an enormous range of interests and passions, but it was the landscapes and the wild-life that mostly stopped me as I drifted around. This is indeed a lovely corner of England, and the painters of Mellor have captured in no small measure its breath-taking scenery, and the creatures who inhabit it. I am not an artist myself, and find it difficult to 'read' a picture, so was glad that I could enjoy these painting for their sincerity and straightforwardness, and felt that the artists had succeeded in drawing me into their love of this land, and enabling me to see something of it through their eyes. I was glad the exhibition was not a competition, for I felt it would be wrong to make appraisals, but inevitably I did have my favourites, and if pushed I would go for the blue-tit, peeping out of its nest.

But the art was only the start of the evening. Then came two young soloists: they were very nervous; overawed by such an elderly (for them) audience, but there was nothing to fear, as we were all with them, as their voices were magical. Then the choir itself: how bouncy and jolly they all looked and sounded. They were having fun, and so were we. And then a completely unexpected wonder; a girl playing her flute so beautifully and accompanied on the piano by her grandmother followed by a young man, in his mid-teens I should think, playing the piano in a corner of the church. No music - just enormous quantities of talent and skill, his fingers running up and down the keyboard which was completely under his control. There is a great joy not only in listening to the piano, but in watching the pianist, and he drew a crowd of spectators as well as an audience. Amazing!

And all in such a splendid setting. Most churches, I suppose, take you back in history and, like trees, intimate a story of times past. You stand in a church as you stand by an old oak, and imagine what sights it has seen, what processions have passed within its gaze, what secrets have been whispered within its protection. But when you encounter not only the bricks and mortar, but people themselves, the sense of continuity, of a community that is for ever, is very powerful.

I was looked after very well, and Mellor should be better known. It should be printed in larger letters on the map. It's certainly worth the 250 mile drive from Braintree, and I'll be coming again.
