Joel: *When I walked into the church, I felt very happy because I was being welcomed into God's family and I was also being baptised.*

Harvey: *I just actually felt the same despite the fact that I was being welcomed into God's family.*

William: *As I was taking the wine, my whole life was reflecting back and I knew this was a very special moment for me.*

School closes for the summer on Wednesday 23rd July when we will hold our Leavers' Service at 2:15pm in the school hall.

I hope that all parishioners have a lovely, sunny summer.

Dear Friends

“Wanted, Christians, seven days a week and no holidays!” so declared a poster outside the church not far from where my parents live. I’m not sure whether it sounds like a great adventure or a hard slog! Something of both I’m tempted to say. But that’s what being a disciple of Christ is all about – being a Christian doesn’t stop at the church door on Sunday morning (or evening). Being a Christian is a life-long commitment; truly seven days a week and no holidays.

I was once approached by someone in another parish (far away from our United Benefice) who complained about the fact that he was expected to pay for his parish magazine. “I belong to a lot of clubs and my membership fee covers the magazines there!” he almost snapped. It took me some time to explain that being a Christian wasn’t about being a member of a club and contributing to the work and mission of the Church wasn’t a membership fee! Baptism wasn’t something that you can pay your dues for – it’s a free gift of God, a sacrament, an outward visible sign of an inward spiritual grace, and that’s not something you can buy any more than you can buy love. Baptism and Confirmation that follows it are responses on our part to the wonderful offering of love that God holds out to us as we partake of the new life in Christ Jesus our Lord and Saviour. And that is truly a life changing event that affects everything we are and everything we do.

The eternal God incarnate in Jesus Christ humbled Godself and entered into time and space, into an actual physical place and an historical time and so shows us that nothing and nowhere is outside God’s loving concern. Being a disciple is a response to that amazing act of love and is itself an offering of love. Being a disciple of Christ can and will change our lives – all of our lives – for nothing is beyond God’s loving care and concern. So we can’t separate our faith lives from our family life, work life, political life, or social life; or even from our ‘consumer’ life. God the Holy Spirit cannot be confined to a once a week Sunday service; God the Holy Spirit breaks through our carefully constructed mental ‘boxes’ and insists of being part of all of our life not just the ‘holy’ bits! So try as we might we can’t be part-time Christians for to be a true disciple of Christ is indeed “seven days a week and no holidays!”

Soldiers of Samlesbury from the Great War

3rd August 2014 marks the Centenary of the outbreak of World War 1, and there were some soldiers from Samlesbury who went to war, but did not come back. Samlesbury War Memorial Hall Trustees have been successful in gaining a grant of £9,800 from Heritage Lottery Fund, which has been topped up to a total of £10,000 by Samlesbury & Cuerdale Parish Council to research these men : their lives, who they were, as well as their military records.

As part of this, a Commemorative Lunch will be held at the Hall on Sunday 3rd August 12.30pm for 1.00pm with readings and music from the time. There will be an exhibition of memorabilia and, if you have a relative who was lost in WW1, or have items which could be borrowed for that day, we would love to hear from you.

The Lunch itself is subsidised by the Grant, it will be a three course Sunday Roast, and it will take place over most of the afternoon, giving you a chance to join in with the project. It is anticipated that this will prove popular, and therefore tickets, priced at £10 per head will go on

sale on 1st July. These can only be paid for in advance, and will be limited with the priority to relatives of The Fallen.

Commemorate and remember World War One Saturday 23rd August 2014 at the Village Hall

On 23rd August 1914, in their first confrontation on European soil since the Battle of Waterloo Battle, four divisions of the British Expeditionary Force, engaged the German 1st Army over the 60-foot-wide Mons Canal in Belgium, near the French frontier.

One hundred years later we can be thankful that our community is able to get together and mark the centenary of the start of World War One.

The Village Hall will be hosting a day long event, starting with an exhibition of memorabilia kindly donated by villagers, artefacts from The East Lancashire Regimental Museum and project work from pupils at St Mary's.

In the evening there will be a social event in the hall including music from Balderstone Brass Band, a "singalong" led by the Mellor Singing Group, a pie and pea supper and topical quiz.

Tickets for the evening will be on sale soon at £6 per person. All proceeds from the event will be shared between the Help for Heroes charity and Village Hall funds.
