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## Dear Friends

"What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet."  
*Romeo and Juliet (II, ii, 1-2)*, such was Juliet's plaintive cry as she pondered Romeo's family name.

Names, or at least titles, have been much on my horizon over the last couple of months. At the beginning of June, having served my five year term of office, I stood down as superior of the Order of the Companions of Martha and Mary; and so Sister Judith became Amma Judith as she was formally installed as the new superior. So now I revert to simply "Sister". (Don't worry I shall still answer to Amma Sue!) However, Sister is not my only title. I'm also Reverend and Doctor – (that's Doctor of Philosophy so please don't ask me for any cough mixture; the only medical "stuff" I know is how to put someone onto the recovery position and scream for help - and I have a tendency to come over all peculiar at the sight of blood!) In addition, from the 20<sup>th</sup> September I shall have a new title "Canon of Whalley" (ancient spelling) as I will be installed at the Cathedral at the 4.00pm Evensong on that day.

All those names or titles have a particular meaning in my life and, depending in the occasion

or situation differing ones will take precedence. Nevertheless, they have no power to confer either “goodness” or “piety,” or make me any better a disciple than anyone else in the Body of Christ. Regardless of what we have, what we know, or what we do, we are all members of Christ’ Body, the Church, sons and daughters of God who loves each and every one of us more than we can know or imagine. I’m sure that when the day comes and we meet our loving Father face to face we won’t be asked how many titles we have but how much we have loved God and neighbour.

In John’s Gospel, as Jesus said goodbye to his disciples he said: “No longer do I call you servants...but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you” [John 15.15]. And that is surely the greatest of promises and the greatest of names: “Friend of Jesus”. So, dear sisters and brothers remember you are a beloved Child of God no matter what have, or have not, achieved; regardless of what title you have, or don’t have – God knows you by your name and it will always be a “sweet” name to God.

I walked in to find nine children ALL fully occupied in a range of creative activities, cutting, colouring, sticking, choosing and sharing. An air of total concentration prevailed, quite unusual for a lively bunch of Belarussian children. There was Aliaksandr, (Sasha for short) Aliaksandra, (also Sasha for short) Liudmila, (Luda) Maryia (Masha) Daryia (Dasha) Pavel (Pasha) Yuliya, Anton, Nikita, 4 lads and 5 lasses, all in the very capable hands of Rita, Jean and Sheila, (you know who they are!), with help, if needed, from Yulyia and Sergei, the two Interpreters.

The children produced a number of items, using colourful craft materials, and their own imagination and ideas. Green and blue feathers were flying, but only as far as two little puppet birds, who made an appearance at the end of the morning.

There was even an edible element, when some little buns were iced, and decorated with sprinkles, and then, of course, eaten.

At the end of the morning, the children gathered round in a circle on the carpet, and learning an action song, using the little birds, they had made: `one named Peter, and one named Paul`.

They also jumped in surprise at the tale of a mouse hiding in a hole. You could have heard a pin drop. Then, what better way for the children to sing their thanks to Rita, Jean and Sheila, than in a rousing chorus of "This is the day that the Lord has made", in English and in Belarussian, followed by, "If you're happy and you know it", with several verses and actions to match.

It was one of those moments we often wish we could `bottle`, and we thank Rita, Sheila and Jean for all the thought they had given to the morning's activities.

It was also a reminder of the Parable of the Talents...generous and effective use of Time, Skills and Resources for the benefit of others.
